### Phil Steele Demonstration 9/9/2023 Turning a 4-legged Stool

In the morning session, Phil turned a small 4-legged stool that could also be used as a small table or a plant stand. Starting with the seat, Phil trued up the edge of a 9" ash blank and flattened what would become the underside of the Stool seat. He then marked a circle 6"

diameter to align the leg holes. Using a home-made drilling jig, Phil used a 22mm spade bit with the tip ground down to drill the first leg hole. The jig has a natural depth stop so the hole depth did not need to be marked. The spade bit cuts better than a forstner bit when drilling at an angle. Phil uses an angle of 12° for a tall stool and an angle of 15° for a short stool. The angle was set using a protractor. Phil used a ruler across the centre to set the position of the second hole







at 180° to the first. He then used a square to mark the third hole at 90° and the ruler again to mark the position of the fourth hole. After drilling all four leg holes, Phil cut a chucking recess on the underside of the seat. To do this, he used a beading/skew tool and also

a home-made scraper to cut the dovetail. Phil used a pull cut to clean up the underside and round over the edge. Mounting it on the chuck recess,

Phil used a pull cut to clean up the face. If it is to be used as a table or plant stand, the top must be flat. Phil then rounded over the edge of the seat top and turned a cove into the edge. Phil finished the top by sanding.

### Phil Steele Demo - continued

Phil mounted a straight-grained Ash blank between centres for the leg. The length for a short stool is 10" and 27" for a normal size stool. Using a Continental gouge, Phil turned the blank to round and down to a maximum diameter of 38mm. He then used a skew to plane the surface. Using a 7/8" spanner, Phil sized the tenon to fit into the underside of the seat. 7/8" is just slightly larger than the 22m seat holes so the legs will be a tight fit. Using a template, Phil marked the position of decorative beads. He used an Ashley Isles beading tool to cut the beads. The bottom of the leg was tapered down to 1" diameter. When turning the other three legs, Phil used a variety of gouges to show that a variety of tools can be used to achieve the same result. It also showed off Phil's skill at using the skew, the 3-point tool and several different types of gouge. The leg spreader is positioned approx 4" down from the top of the legs. Phil used a 1/2" forstner bit to drill the holes in the legs for the



two spreader bars. After turning the two

spreaders, Phil drilled a 12mm in the centre of both spreader bars to take the central spreader bar that sits between the two other spreader bars. Phil used a home-made jig to measure the length of the spreader bars. This consisted of two threaded rods and a lock nut that was small enough to fit inside the leg holes. After sanding the legs and spreader bars, Phil assembled the stool without glue and passed it round the audience. That completed the morning session.

### Peter Wright Demonstration 9/9/2023

Peter started the afternoon session by turning a lidded Oak box. Mounting a 4" diameter by 8" long blank in the chuck, he trued up the face and marked the division between the base and lid about 4" from the chuck and



parted off the lid. Peter then used a point tool to mark the base of the box just leaving enough to part off. Using a spindle gouge, Peter turned a bead at the bottom of the box. He then turned the outside of the box into a ball



shape. Peter drilled a hole down the centre of the box to give a depth limit when hollowing. Using a 3/8" spindle gouge, he hollowed out the centre, switching to a 1/2" gouge as the overhang increased. Finally Peter finished the hollowing with a swan-necked, tungsten carbide tipped, hollowing tool. Peter sanded the inside by holding the abrasive in a pair of

forceps to reduce the risk of finger

damage. He sanded to 400 grit for the demo but would sand to 600 grit for an exhibition piece. Before removing the piece from the chuck, Peter marked the position of chuck jaw number 1 so he could re-mount



it later with the best chance of it running true. Mounting the lid piece in



the chuck, Peter measured the opening in the base and transferred the measurement to the lid. He used a parting tool to cut a spigot on the lid that was a snug fit into the base. Peter hollowed the lid rather than leave it flat. After mounting the base back in the chuck, he fitted the lid and held it in place with the tail

### Peter Wright Demo - continued

stock. Peter domed the lid but left it overhanging at the join between lid and base. He then sanded the lid, leaving a flat at the top to fit a finial. Peter mount-



ed a piece of Blackwood in the chuck and turned the diameter down to match the flat on the lid. He turned a point on the end, a ball on the bottom and an oval in the middle. Unfortunately, the Blackwood was very crumbly and Peter couldn't finish the finial. An attempt to turn an onion finial out of the Oak at the top of the lid also failed.

Peter's second item was a Bud Vase in Sapele. He drilled a 16mm hole down the centre to take a plastic insert. Peter buys these 20 for £5 off Amazon. Bringing the tail stock up for support, Peter turned a long



flowing cove from the top to nearly halfway down the 8" blank, leaving a thin (almost too thin) neck. As the neck opened out again into the body, Peter undercut and tapered the rest of the body slightly narrower than the top. He dished the top before sanding, sealing and waxing the bud vase. The plastic tube can be cut with a hacksaw if it is too long for the hole. After parting off, Peter sanded the bottom.
