

Demonstration by Steve Heeley 7/9/24

Steve's first project was a hollow form in Oak.

Starting with a log about 12" long and 4" diameter, he used a Spindle Roughing Gouge

to remove the bark and turn it to round. Steve used a Parting Tool to clean up the tail stock end and to cut a chucking spigot. Steve used calipers to ensure the spigot was the correct size. He then used a skew chisel to dovetail the spigot.





Mounting the piece in a chuck, Steve turned another dovetail spigot at the tail stock end. Steve marked a line approximately 1/3 along the blank. This would be the top of the vase. He also marked the waste wood at the end



Steve then parted off the top of the vase and began to shape the body with a Spindle Gouge.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

Steve then drilled down the vase using a drill bit fixed in a handle. This is quicker and easier than using a Jacob's chuck. He then hollowed out the vase first using a spindle gouge then using a Simon Hope



hollowing tool. He left a re-





cess at the top of the vase for the lid.

Steve then started on the separate top of the vase. He cut a spigot to fit into the recess on the vase body and drilled through the centre. He then started to shape the neck of the vase.



Steve glued the vase top to the body using super glue, making sure the grain was aligned. He sometime hides the join with a v-cut or texturing.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

Steve shaped the neck further and curved the top down to the centre hole. He further refined the shape of the body and parted off.



To finish the base, Steve made a jam chuck to hold the top while the tail stock supported the base. He carefully dished the base to make its thickness the same as the side walls of the vase.




The completed vase. An oil finish will be applied later.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

Steve's second piece was a Satin Bowl on a Stand. Starting with a Tulipwood bowl blank approximately 9" round by 4" deep, he mounted it on a screw chuck and brought up the tail stock for support. Steve turned a chucking spigot on the base before shaping the outside. The spigot will be removed later.

Holding it on the spigot, Steve turned the rim slightly concave and hollowed out the bowl.



Using a Dremel-type tool, fitted with a carving hand piece (cutter reciprocates rather than rotates), Steve carved vines free hand. He did this with the bowl off the lathe and while seated for maximum control.



The finished bowl. Unfortunately, woodworm had penetrated deep into the timber and was visible on the surface of the rim.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

The stand for the bowl was turned from a block of Oak. Steve turned it to round and tapered it from 3" at the head stock end, to 1 1/2" at the tail stock end. He then dished the end to match the curve of the bowl.




Steve said he could ebonise the stand or texture it but instead, he burnt two decorative rings top and bottom. He then parted off.

Steve Heeley Demonstration - continued

Steve's kept us guessing for his last project of the day. Starting with a spindle blank of Ash 7" long by 3" square, he turned it to round and reduced the diameter to 2". He then shaped the outside of the bowl.



Steve then hollowed it out. At this point, it could be a goblet but some people said (correctly) that it was going to be a scoop.



After hollowing, Steve shaped the handle.


He said the scoop could be cut with a saw but Steve used a sanding disc fitted in the lathe head stock.



A scoop must be finished with a food safe finish.



Members' Work - Alan Roberts

This month, I have a fun piece made by Alan Roberts. Thanks to Peter and Audrey Wright for persuading Alan to send in this piece.

Hello, my name is Alan Roberts. I joined the Coombe Abbey Woodturners a few years ago and usually attend the workshop every other Tuesday with Peter Wright, a long term member.

With Peter's guidance along, with much encouragement from Eric Taylor and Graham Cashmore, I have honed my skills and techniques to be able to follow an idea that I had seen on the Internet. Recently I decided I would like to make something for my sister Margaret who lives in the Ramsgate area. My wife Joan, suggested I make her a clown clock. She had seen some ideas on the Internet. I did a sketch of the clown to incorporate the black clock face I had purchased, in order to get the sizing

and the balance in proportion. The main body was turned from Elm, the face and bow from Sapele and the hat from Oak. Surprising what you can make out of a few off cuts sitting around the workshop. Upon assembling, I decided to paint the hat and feet in black to complement the clock face. Initially I did it in matt black and was disappointed, so then I applied a coat of gloss and I am very pleased with the result. My sister recently visited us for a few days and was absolutely delighted with the finished article. As with all wood turners, you make something different and everyone wants one. So version 2 is already being primed and ready to turn. The down side is I am having difficulty sourcing a black clock face, any suggestions.


