

Alan Truman 21/8/12

Hinckley Woodturning Club

Alan's project for the evening was an octagonal scalloped pomander bowl done in three stages - bowl, lid and finial. He had already prepared the bowl blank by cutting the 8 scallops on a band saw. Alan had also

prepared the lid by part drilling the pomander holes. A second set of prepared pomander blanks was kindly donated to the club as a raffle prize.

Alan mounted the bowl blank on a screw chuck and used a bowl gouge to flatten the bottom and create a chucking recess. He then shaped the base into a gentle curve and added some decoration to the centre of the chucking recess. Alan power sanded from 120 grit to 240 grit, followed by two coats of Chestnut cellulose



sanding sealer (thinned 50/50) and finished with Briwax applied with 0000 wire wool. This was buffed up using a soft cloth.

Alan then mounted the bowl on the chuck and flattened the top. He marked the size of the bowl approximately 3/4" in from the scallops. Alan



hollowed out the centre, re-sharpening his gouge before the last cut. He then power sanded to 320 grit for a better finish for the inside. Two coats of sanding sealer and Briwax



were used to finish the inside of the bowl.

Alan's tip - before removing the bowl from the chuck, rotate it 1/8th of a turn in the jaws and re-tighten. This removes the little dimples of wood between the chuck jaws

Alan Truman Demo - continued

Alan then mounted the pre-prepared pomander lid on to a screw chuck. This was turned to round and flattened. He then measured the diameter of the bowl and transferred this measurement to the top. Alan cut a spigot

just larger than this measurement and reduced its size until he got a "relaxed" fit with the bowl. The lid was then sized to be less then the inside diameter of the scallops. Alan turned a bead on the edge of the lid using a point tool and finished with a spindle gouge. He then hollowed out the centre of the lid. The inside needs a chucking recess. This is better than relying on the central hole being parallel enough to reverse it on to a screw chuck from the inside. The inside



of the lid was sealed (to stop smells penetrating) but not polished. Alan



mounted the lid on the recess and proceeded to turn the top of the lid into a gentle curve. Using a homemade sanding drum, Alan sanded the holes. He also used a cotton bud to seal and wax them.

Alan then turned a finial/handle out of yew. The hole in the top of the finial made

by the tailstock was filled with pencil lead. This makes it look as though it goes right the way through. The hole in the bottom of the finial was filled with a decorative ball. Alan used carnuba wax on the finial to give it a shinier finish. He said a finished item would sell for about £25. Other good woods to use are yew and laburnum. A lighter top and darker base also works.

Dennis Keeling 21/8/13

Hinckley Woodturning Club



Dennis started with a slide show that explained why he started segmented turning and showed many of his award winning pieces. Some of these use alternating layers of plywood and coloured Perspex. After much

experimentation, Dennis has found that Five Star Adhesives' "Clear'N'Tuf'

"Clear'N'Tuf" flexible CA (su-

per glue) is the only one that successfully glues these two materials. He gets his Perspex sheets off the internet, at a cost of £12 for a mixed pack of A4 sheets. Perspex sheets must be roughed up for the glue to hold. The plywood must be birch ply, B1, B2 or A grade. Dennis cuts the materials into 8" squares and stacks them 8" high. Before gluing, Dennis marks a circle on one side of the cube. He then transfers these marks across each slice and hollows each slice on the lathe to save time later. The plywood has to be cut from both sides to stop breakout.

Dennis only puts glue on the Perspex sheets. The plywood is too absorbent. Dennis lets the cube cure for 24 hours before slicing it diagonally. This produces two bowl blanks. He cuts off the corners and carefully glues on a faceplate. To stop dangerous shards of Perspex from flying off the top, he also glues an



MDF ring over the top of the bowl. This will be turned away as late as possible. Wearing a glove to protect his hand, Dennis hollows the inside first using a Simon Hope tungsten carbide tipped tool. He uses a circle template to get the perfect round shape on the inside. This is indicated by a "bullseye" in the plywood rings.

Alan then turned his attention to the spindles between the plates. Using smaller O'Donnell jaws, Alan mounted what looked like a wooden pen

Dennis Keeling Demo - continued



A teardrop scraper smoothed the inside. Dennis rough sands the inside and then coats it with Isaac Lord's Mitre adhesive (a type of super glue). This supports the wood fibres allowing a second use of the scraper to produce a finer finish. Another coat of super glue is sanded to 1000 grit to produce a glossy finish. The bowl is parted off and reverse

chucked to turn the outside. An MDF cone in the chuck supports the inside.



The outside of the bowl is turned in a similar manner, using bowl gouges, negative rake scrapers and TCT tools. Again, the aim is to get a second bullseye on the outside, before applying a super glue finish.

Alan Truman 16/8/2016 Hinckley Woodturning Club Demo



Alan showed us how to turn a two-tier cupcake stand in Sycamore and Yew. He was also selling kits, so we could make one ourselves, for a reasonable £10. Alan mounted the larger Sycamore blank on a screw chuck and squared up the edge using a 3/8 bowl gouge. He then turned the bottom slightly concave before cutting a chuck recess. Alan left 3/4" of timber outside the recess to act as a foot before creating a gentle ogee curve on the bottom and rounding over the edge. He then power sanded 120 grit to 240

grit, sealed the base with Chestnut sanding sealer (thinned 50/50) and waxed it with Briwax, applied with 0000 wire wool.

After holding the piece using the chuck recess, Alan flattened the face

and drilled a centre hole 5/8" wide and approximately 5/8" deep. He then marked the diameter of the central boss, before removing material to leave the centre raised. Alan refined the taper of the centre boss, flattened the plate and left a raised ring around the outside, followed by power sanding. For decoration, Alan burned two rings into the surface of the plate and textured the areas between, before sealing and waxing as before.





Alan turned the smaller top plate in a similar fashion. Being smaller, the top plate only had one decorative ring and didn't require a foot on the bottom. The central boss was also correspondingly smaller.



Alan Truman Demonstration - continued

For the finial and centre spacer, Alan used a pen blank, mounted between the chuck and tail centre. He used a roughing gouge to turn it to round and a skew chisel to smooth it out. Alan marked a 1/2" long spigot at each end

and, using vernier calipers set to 5/8", he cut the spigots to match the holes in the plates. The spigots were finished with a chamfer and under cut to ensure a clean fit to the plate. The shape of the spigot was then cut with a spindle gouge. Alan marked some decorative lines and used a piece of Formica to burn in the lines.



He then sanded 120 grit to 400 grit before sealing and waxing as before. After aligning the grain direction, the spigots were inserted into the holes in the plates. The top spigot only needed one spigot, with a ball on the

other end to act as a handle.






Hi Rob.


